
WHAT IS ECG?

ELECTROCARDIOGRAM (ECG) MEASURES HEART RATE



WE ARE INTERESTED IN ECG TO LOOK AT
HOW PEOPLE REACT IN DIFFERENT
SITUATIONS WHILE EXPERIENCING DIFFERENT
EMOTIONS.

ECG INVOLVES PLACING ELECTRODES ON THE CHEST WITH ADHESIVE TO "LISTEN" TO THE HEART.

THE ECG ELECTRODES ARE VERY SAFE TO WEAR AND DO NOT SEND ANYTHING INTO THE BODY.

SOMETIMES THE ADHESIVE WE USE TO STICK THE ELECTRODES TO THE SKIN WILL CAUSE SOME MILD SKIN ITCHINESS OR REDNESS. REMOVING ELECTRODES CAN CAUSE MINOR DISCOMFORT, THOUGH THIS IS TYPICALLY LESS PAINFUL THAN REMOVING A BAND-AID.
